

Thinking queerly about identities



- From political economies of identity to political ecologies of identity
- Lessons from queer theoretical approaches
 - Thinking of sexuality as an assemblage (of practices, bodies, discourses etc)
 - Understanding identity as performed
 - Recognising that bodies, acts and identities do not always align as expected

Towards a green and just future





- From environmental activism to environmental solutions
- Lessons from eco-housing:
 - Importance of cultural analysis of housing and home, people more important than structure
 - Attachment to counter-cultural 'alternative' identity
 - Missing concerns for justice and equality
 - Hidden discourses around gender, and absence of discourse on race, sexuality, disability etc

Key themes

- The seminar focuses on three interlinked themes:
 - How contemporary identities have been shaped by the high carbon economy
 - How those identities might change and be reconfigured through the process of transition to a sustainable, low carbon future
 - What it means to identify with (movements for) sustainability transitions.
